First, native QlikView notes do not attach to particular data points, but only to objects—which is not where the insight typically is. Second, an author of a native QlikView note is not able to attract the attention of intended recipients; hoping that intended users will notice a note and act on it is not an effective BI tactic. Another limitation is that there is no way for the author to control which users should or should

not have an access to a particular note. Likewise, hoping that unintended users will not notice a confidential note is clearly not a security best practice.”

“Thus, whenever QlikView users need to solicit feedback, share an insight, or assign a data discovery task, they have to resort to archaically either scheduling a web conference or taking screenshots of relevant data points in QlikView, pasting the images into Outlook and writing a lengthy email,” Harmsen laments. “Either method, unfortunately all too common, is disruptive and inefficient. If the email does not get completely lost in the flood of corporate communications, the idea and information flow becomes protracted with the inevitable loss of potentially actionable and timely data insights.”

“I feel that [iinsight for QlikView™](#) simply and elegantly solves the annotation dilemma and shifts collaboration into a gear not available to QlikView users before. The notification mechanism has the familiar feel of common social media notifications, and is thus intuitive to users. Information can flow downward only or be bidirectional. The built-in management console makes it very easy to create distribution groups and assign read-only or editing rights to any authenticated users on a server.
